



If you are playing on the seesaw with your friend and it's time to line up and go inside, what should you do?

If you think you should stay and play, let me see you hold up one hand.

If you think you should go inside and tell your friends to come too, let me see you hold up both of your super hands.

That's right! You can be a leader by showing others how to obey.

Let's say this together:

I Can (thumbs point to self)

Be A Leader! (punch up)

If your mommy tells you and your sister to be quiet while your baby brother sleeps, can you show your sister how to be quiet?

If you show your sister what to do, you're being a leader!

Let's say this together:

I Can (thumbs point to self)

Be A Leader! (punch up)

Do you like playing games at church?

Sometimes everybody wants to go first when we play a game.

If you can let somebody else go first, then clap your super hands.

BAM! You got it! You can be a leader by letting others go first.

Let's say this together:

I Can (thumbs point to self)

Be A Leader! (punch up)

Do you ever see new people at our church?

Sometimes new people feel lonely.

If you do not see anyone talking to a new person, what can you do?

(Ask them to play with you, show them how to make a craft, bring them a toy, etc.)

You can be a leader by showing new people how to have fun at church!

Let's say this together:

I Can (thumbs point to self)

Be A Leader! (punch up)



Stomp your feet if you like to play soccer!

What if your coach tells you to run this way (point right) but your friend wants you to run this way (point left)?

Can you be a leader by showing your friend how to do what your coach says?

Yes! You can be a leader!

Let's say this together:

I Can (thumbs point to self)

Be A Leader! (punch up)

Do you like to stand up and sing songs at church?

After we sing, what do we do—sit down or keep standing? (Sit down)

If you can show the people around you how to sit down, then pat the floor.

Showing others what to do is how you can be a leader!

Let's say this together:

I Can (thumbs point to self)

Be A Leader! (punch up)

Does your dad ever tell you to pick up your toys before supper?

If your brother wants to run to supper without helping pick up the toys, should you run with him or stay and pick up the toys? (Stay and pick up toys)

You can be a leader by showing your brother how to obey your dad.

Let's say this together:

I Can (thumbs point to self)

Be A Leader! (punch up)

Touch your toes if you have a bike!

If your friend is scared to ride your bike, can you show him how to ride it?

Yeah! You can be leader by showing him how to do it!

Let's say this together:

I Can (thumbs point to self)

Be A Leader! (punch up)



Touch your head if you like to throw a ball with your friends!

Let's pretend that your teacher at church asks you to roll the ball on the ground instead of throw it.

If your friend still wants to throw the ball, what should you do? (Roll ball, ask friend to roll ball, etc.)

Showing your friend how to do what is right makes you a leader like Deborah!

Let's say this together:

I Can (thumbs to chest)

Be A Leader! (punch up)

When you are at home, what do you do with your plate & cup after dinner?

You can be a leader by putting your plate and cup away after dinner!

Let's say this together:

I Can (thumbs to chest)

Be A Leader! (punch up)

If your friends are saying bad words, how can you be a leader? (Not say bad words, ask them not to say bad words)

If you say bad words, too, are you being a leader? (No)

You can be a leader like Deborah by showing your friends how to do what is right.

Let's say this together:

I Can (thumbs to chest)

Be A Leader! (punch up)

Do you love to run and jump in the pool?

If the lifeguard blows the whistle and tells you and your friends to walk, what should you do?

If you show your friends how to walk at the pool, you are being a leader like Deborah!

Let's say this together:

I Can (thumbs point to self)

Be A Leader! (punch up)
